The European Union (EU) and the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) are implementing component one of the regional programme: 10th European Development Fund (EDF 10) Adapting to Climate Change and Sustainable Energy (ACSE).

The EU-GIZ ACSE Programme is being implemented in fifteen Pacific Island countries (Cook Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Kiribati, Republic of the Marshall Islands, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Timor Leste, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu).

The objectives of the EU-GIZ ACSE Programme are to:

- i) Enhance sustainable livelihoods in Pacific Island Countries (PICs);
- ii) Strengthen countries' capacities to adapt to the adverse effects of climate change; and,
- iii) Enhance their energy security at the national, provincial and local/community levels

The EU-GIZ ACSE Programme is looking to recruit suitably qualified consultants for the programme's Regional Assessment Board (RAB). The role of the RAB is to assess and approve draft Project Design Documents (PDDs) submitted by the fifteen participating countries.

To this end, the programme is looking to recruit the services of:

- **2 independent external experts in the field of climate change adaptation (CCA); and,**
- **2 independent external experts in the field of sustainable energy (SE);**

The experts will be contracted to GIZ for a period of up to 22 working days (excluding travel) between May and August 2015.
